


























Meaning of Colors and Coat of Arms Symbols









Red	As a positive, it means passionate about something, a strong will to survive, a willingness to take action, a strong will to do something, confidence As a negative, it means anger or hatred, revenge
Orange	Optimistic or hopeful personality, warmth, happiness, emotional strength, uplifting spirit, enthusiasm for life
Yellow	As a positive, it means happiness, hopefulness, new ideas, creativity, a bright mind, optimism As a negative, it can mean cowardice or weakness
Green	As a positive, it can mean balance, growth, self-reliance, independence, renewal, restoration, peace, a sense of right or wrong, prosperity or wealth, endurance As a negative, it can mean jealousy, possessiveness, or materialistic, a need to own people or objects.
Blue	As a positive, it is a color of trust and loyalty, calm and peace, it suggests loyalty and integrity (sense of righteousness), inner security and confidence As a negative, it can indicate being too rigid or too self-righteous, emotionally unstable, or too conservative
Indigo (blue/purple color)	As a positive, it includes integrity and sincerity, structure and regulations, someone who is highly responsible and obedient As a negative, it includes someone who might be judgmental, intolerant, or inconsiderate.
Purple	As a positive, it shows someone who has a lot of imagination, who has deep or emotional thoughts, also someone who is creative, mysterious, full of fantasy and wonder, or has a sense of royalty As a negative, it can imply immaturity, being too imaginative or arrogant
Pink	As a positive, it is a sign of unconditional love and nurturing As a negative, it can also be immature, silly, or girlish
Brown	As a positive or a negative, it means serious, down-to-earth, relating to security or protection, it suggests material wealth
Gray	As a positive, it means solid, stable, a sense of calm and composure, relief from a chaotic world As a negative, it can mean boring, drab, or depressing, emotionless
Black	Is the color of the hidden, secretive and the unknown, creating an air of mystery. It keeps things bottled up inside, hidden from the world.
White	Is the color of perfectionism, purity, innocence, wholeness, or reflection.




Coat of Arms Symbols

<p>Acorn</p> 	<p>Life, fertility, immortality and perseverance</p>
<p>Anchor</p> 	<p>Christian emblem of hope and refuge; awarded to sea warriors for special feats performed Also signifies steadfastness and stability. In seafaring nations, the anchor is a symbol of good luck, of safety, and of security</p>
<p>Anvil</p> 	<p>Honour and strength; chief emblem of the smith's trade</p>
<p>Bear</p> 	<p>royal emblem for the kingdoms of Persia and Russia, and the Celts considered the Bear the symbol of the great warrior</p>
<p>Boar</p> 	<p>Strength, courage, and ferocity</p>
<p>Bull</p> 	<p>Symbol of courage, a fiery temperament, and a role as the dedicated father or family member.</p>
<p>Cinquefoil</p> 	<p>A five-leaved flower signifying hope and joy</p>
<p>Crane</p> 	<p>Representative of long life, fidelity, grace, prosperity and peace.</p>

<p>Crescent</p> 	<p>Said to signify one who has been enlightened and honored by the gracious aspect of his sovereign; also a symbol of 'hope and greater glory'. Also used as a mark of cadency of the 2nd son</p>
<p>Dagger</p> 	<p>A symbol of power, justice, valor and military honor.</p>
<p>Dolphin</p> 	<p>charity and affection towards children and kindred.</p>
<p>Dragon</p> 	<p>Alchemy, the elements, eternal change, discovery of hidden treasures and the protector of all you possess.</p>
<p>Eagle</p> 	<p>noble device signifying a person of action, ever more occupied in high and weighty affairs, and one of lofty spirit, ingenious, speedy in apprehension, and judicious in matters of ambiguity; true magnanimity and fortitude of mind; a symbol of power and sovereignty. The Eagle also symbolizes courage, freedom, and immortality.</p>
<p>Elephant</p> 	<p>Great strength, greater wit and greatest ambition.</p>
<p>Fox</p> 	<p>Signifies one who will use all that he may possess of wisdom and wit in his own defence, and denotes one of strategic talents and fertility of resources.</p>
<p>Greyhound</p> 	<p>Denotes majesty, courage, vigilance, swiftness and loyalty, and they were emblematic of nobility.</p>
<p>Goat</p>	<p>One who wins through politics and wit rather than war and confrontation; Perseverance and vitality</p>

	
<p>Griffin</p> 	<p>Ideal combination of swiftness, strength and intelligence. Historically the Griffin has been emblematic of valor, vigilance and death defying bravery.</p>
<p>Holly</p> 	<p>Indicates directed balance and vigor to fight if the cause is just; symbol of truth.</p>
<p>Horse</p> 	<p>Symbol of strength, virility and lust; Also a symbol for loyalty and devotion, such as the faith it has with its master; warrior spirit, bravery and courage.</p>
<p>Leopard</p> 	<p>represents those brave and generous warriors who have performed some bold enterprise with force, courage, promptitude, and activity.</p>
<p>Lion</p> 	<p>Emblem of majesty, strength, and justice, military might and deathless courage</p>
<p>Portcullis</p> 	<p>Symbol of security and protection.</p>
<p>Scales</p> 	<p>Justice, order and balance</p>
<p>Serpent</p> 	<p>Symbol of wisdom, cunning and sagacity.</p>

<p>Shamrock (Trefoil)</p> 	<p>Denotes omnipotence, providence and perpetuity; has been associated with good fortune and luck. Also the national symbol of Ireland. The trefoil is a three-leaved figure usually slipped at the base and symbolic of perpetuity.</p>
<p>Sun</p> 	<p>Power, glory, illumination, vitality, and the source of life on earth. Symbolism also applies to a single sun ray. Most often depicted in its splendour (glory)</p>
<p>Swan</p> 	<p>Emblem of chivalry; Represents music and poetry, especially that which is divinely inspired, passionate or tragic.</p>
<p>Sword</p> 	<p>Power, protection, authority, strength, and courage. It is a symbol of knighthood and chivalry.</p>
<p>Thistle</p> 	<p>The Order of the Thistle represents the highest honour in Scotland, and it is second only in precedence to the Order of the Garter; Symbol of independence, strength, protection and healing.</p>
<p>Tiger</p> 	<p>Symbolic of royalty, power, and fearlessness, and was known to be dangerous if aroused.</p>
<p>Torch</p> 	<p>Illumination, enlightenment, and guidance; often referred to as the torch of learning.</p>
<p>Tortoise</p> 	<p>symbol of longevity, patience and practicality; strength and time. It is also one of independence because it takes its home with it and is well protected.</p>

<p>Unicorn</p> 	<p>Innocence and purity</p>
<p>Willow Tree</p> 	<p>symbol of beauty, grace, endurance and strength.</p>
<p>Wolf</p> 	<p>Symbol of strength, intelligence and courage.</p>
